All members on the MSH database will be receiving, along with Families Worldwide (either by email, post, or distribution), a letter with an urgent appeal for financial donations to enable the work of Mothers' Union to continue.


As with other charities, Mary Sumner House is struggling financially, and the situation is now urgent. Because of the devastating effects of coronavirus, along with declining membership, reduced income from cancelled conference fees, events, and fundraising, etc... MSH is anticipating a loss in excess of £1m.

Members are not being expected to bear the burden of this short-fall alone - only those who wish to and are able to contribute, are being asked to help with donations. MSH recognises that many of us will also be experiencing financial difficulties. Corporate funding is being sought. As a cost-cutting exercise, MSH is now closed until the 21<sup>st</sup> April, staff are being furloughed, working from home, and making huge sacrifices.

If you are in a position to help with funds, and would like to do so (be it as a branch or as an individual), please send your gifts to Keith, our Treasurer, clearly marked for the Urgent Appeal, so that the money can be sent to a third party in Slough who are responsible for the management of donations on behalf of MSH. Any gift will be much appreciated.

**But the story doesn't stop there.....** We want to record our gratitude to all at MSH for the measures they are taking to try and remedy the situation, and the tremendous efforts they are making on our behalf.



Last week, our Trustees, together with Beryl and Keith, met for the first time by Zoom (that is, conferencing over the internet) where we could see the faces and hear the voices of each other to discuss how we feel our diocese should respond to this Appeal. Two weeks' ago Diocesan Presidents from the Canterbury Province, received a devastating letter from Mary Sumner House explaining the profound problem that we, as an organisation, are facing. It took a while to digest. In response, all Diocesan Presidents were summoned to a Zoom meeting arranged by MSH (56 of us were present on the computer screen!). We listened to staff presentations from the CEO and department heads, and had the opportunity to ask questions. Together we have been praying and searching for a way forward, and now all MU members are included.

Via email, I passed on the information and asked for a response from our Board of Trustees. Having been pre-warned, the Trustees decided to set up our own Zoom conference (our first!) to ensure that everyone's voice was heard. After much thought and discussion, and individual prayer, a proposal was put forward on behalf of the members of St Eds&Ips, to immediately send £5,000 from the General Fund to MSH, and this to be reviewed at our next Trustee meeting in May – again probably via Zoom. The proposal was unanimously agreed, and funds sent on Maundy Thursday.



As we are accountable to our membership, we would be very glad to hear your thoughts and views, either by letter, phone or email, but above all we would value your prayerful support as we make these difficult decisions on the very future of the Mothers' Union both here and overseas. As one of our Trustees said, "If central Mothers' Union closes then our diocese closes its doors to our worldwide members". We knew the MU had to change and because of the virus, now is the time.
