


Parking in the Wissett Village Car Park ///booklets.emphasis.afternoon

Just beyond the gate to Halleluiah Cottage is the entrance to the path across the field. Tund left on to it and head for the large gap in the treeline ahead. Keep left through the acre field, and follow the ditch that replaces the hedge in the next to a bridge. Their is an initially steep and potentially slippery slope to the steadier climb to the garden of The Old Rectory.

Cross the field and enter St Peters churchyard through the rose bush lined orchard path beside the retting pond.

Turn right onto Grays Lane past Pear Tree Farm. Can you see a pear tree in their front garden? Turn left up the track to Bulhams, passing the house and continuing as the track surface changes from gravel to grass. At the junction of paths in the open fields, turn left. Ahead under a large Oak turn left and drop down onto the tree-lined path below the field edge. Follow this delightful route past paddocks with horses, sheep and goats to turn right onto Grays Lane. At the 'T' Junction at the bottom of the hill turn left to return to your car.

Turn left on leaving the church to turn left onto the lane past the village hall.

Continue along Hall Lanem down to the culvert over the brook, then up to a Footpath sign under a line of pylons. Turn a right-angle from the road heading just left of the telegraph pole in the middle of the field. As you cross the break in slope you'll see a waymark post and bridge.

Cross the bridge into a wet woodland and go over another bridge. Keep to the right along this long and narrow waisted field until you emerge on Grays Lane at a track through a wood.
